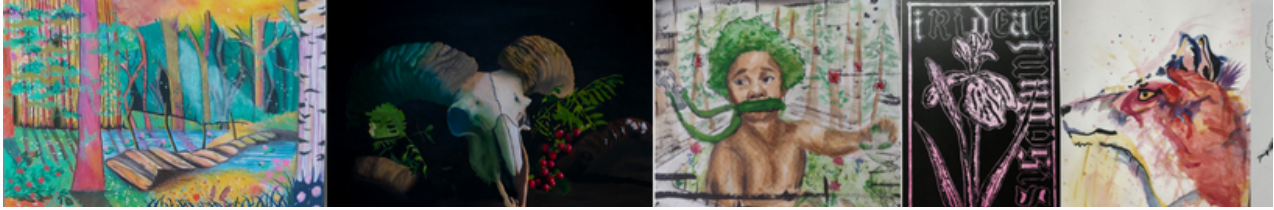

INTRODUCTION

This report covers the academic year September 2021 - August 2022.

ABOUT THE THAMES VALLEY LEARNING PARTNERSHIP (TVLP)

The Thames Valley Learning Partnership (TVLP) is an equal partnership of state and independent secondary-aged schools in Berkshire.

Our aims include:

- Providing collaborative and informative experiences for secondary-aged students across a range of subjects, thereby providing a variety of learning opportunities and diversity in social and cultural engagement.
- Ensuring that staff across our schools are able to share their passion for their specialist subjects and good practice with one another, and exchange views about current educational issues.

OUR HISTORY

The TVLP appointed a part-time Coordinator, Clare Matheson, in September 2019 to launch the TVLP and to create, develop and deliver a programme of events, networks, competitions and actions that would benefit students and staff at the schools in the partnership.

Each school has appointed a member of staff to act as a TVLP Champion, regularly liaising with the TVLP Coordinator and helping to arrange and promote TVLP events, competitions and networks within their school. Beechwood School, Eton College, Holyport College, The Langley Academy, Slough & Eton C of E Business & Enterprise College, St Joseph's Catholic High School, St Mary's School Ascot, The Windsor Boys' School.



All our schools are currently located in either the Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead, or in the Borough of Slough.

COVID-19 OVERVIEW

The spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) started to affect the UK in February 2020. The government advised self-isolation for anyone showing symptoms of infection. It also advised against large group gatherings. A number of lockdowns resulted.

As a result of the vaccination programme rollout, government restrictions were eased, allowing us to hold our first TVLP Student Leadership Conference at Slough & Eton C of E Business & Enterprise College in September 2021.

Towards the end of 2021, a new variant led to rising rates of infection.

In December 2021, face masks became compulsory in most public indoor venues. The TVLP Events Programme (which had been drafted with potential Covid regulations in mind), was largely unaffected.

On 24th February 2021, the government removed the legal requirement to self-isolate following a positive Covid test and also ended routine contact tracing. Close contacts who were fully vaccinated no longer had to test daily for 7 days, while unvaccinated close contacts were not required to self-isolate.

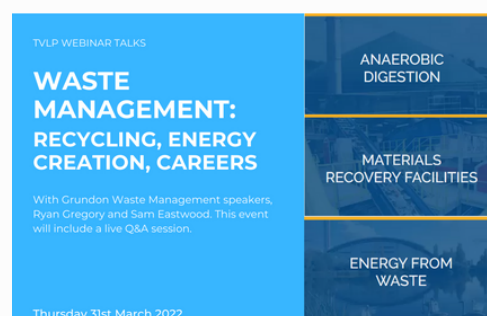

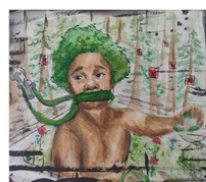
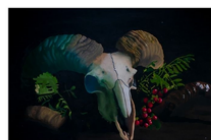


FIRST PLACE:

Our judge loved the strong message portrayed by this art work, which acts as a warning to us all. The concept is really relevant and has been well thought out and executed.

Arabella says: 'The child of 'Mother Earth' is 'forest bathing'. Whilst the child bathes, the trees are marked to be cut down - 'deforestation in the Amazon for example - and vines reach out to suffocate the child - a symbol of the pressure of the world we will inherit and therefore its problems. Although the bath is full of lush shrubbery and flowers, the consuming black darkness (symbolising carbon emissions and crude oil) slowly corrodes and consumes nature.'

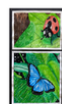

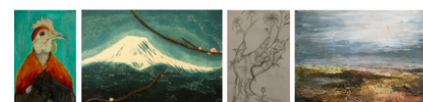

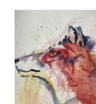

TVLP SCHOOL BIODIVERSITY IMPROVEMENTS: HOLYPORT COLLEGE

Four pupils from Holyport College attended the TVLP trip to RHS Garden Wisley on 16th September 2021. During this visit, they all completed a feedback form outlining the biodiversity changes they would like to see at their school. These included the introduction of a lily pad to the school pond (Erya, Fatima & Peaches), a plank positioned by the side of the pond to help animals climb in and out (Erya, Fatima, Peaches), the possible introduction of tadpoles (Grace, Peaches), and more plants (Grace).

Following consultation with the school, the following items were ordered:

- 2 x Bird nest boxes.
- 1 x Water lily for the school pond.
- 150 x Snowdrop bulbs.
- 60 x English bluebells.

Planting of the bulbs took place on 8th November 2021, with students (pictured below) planting these. The bird boxes were located at the recommended heights in the same area by the school's facilities team.

Monitoring questions completed during planting:

- How many bees can you see in this area? 0

TVLP TRIPS TO RHS GARDEN WISLEY

Our first TVLP trip to RHS Garden Wisley took place on 16th September 2021, as part of the TVLP Biodiversity Project, with a second visit on 5th October 2021. Pupils from Beechwood School, Holyport College, and The Windsor Boys' School attended.

Pupils took part in a formal workshop, led by RHS Garden Wisley's Secondary Education Facilitator, Charlotte Ashe. They learnt about different habitats, wildlife and plants, and had a guided tour of the new RHS Hilltop centre and surrounding gardens, which showcase biodiversity habitats including green roofs, insect hotels, log piles, and a massive wildlife pond.

They also made wildflower seed bombs, which a number of the students stated was their favourite part of the day.

100% of pupils learnt something new from their visit to RHS Garden Wisley.

After lunch, the students had a chance to explore areas of RHS Garden Wisley by themselves, with many choosing to visit the huge cathedral-like Glasshouse, covering the area of 10 tennis courts and rising to 12m (40ft) high. There they saw tree ferns, tall palms, lush-leaved creepers and dazzling flower displays, moving through three climatic zones: tropical, moist temperate and dry temperate.

The feedback received was overwhelmingly positive, with 100% stating they learnt something new and 95% stating they would recommend the trip to a friend.

Information learnt as a result of these trips included facts about different habitats, detritivores & animals that use dead wood, nectar, bees, how plants reproduce, pollen and why it is needed.

During the visit to RHS Garden Wisley, biodiversity improvements pupils suggested making at their school included the introduction of insect hotels, bird nest boxes, more flowers and wildflowers, pond improvements including the introduction of a water lily (for dragonflies), and the creation of a green wall.

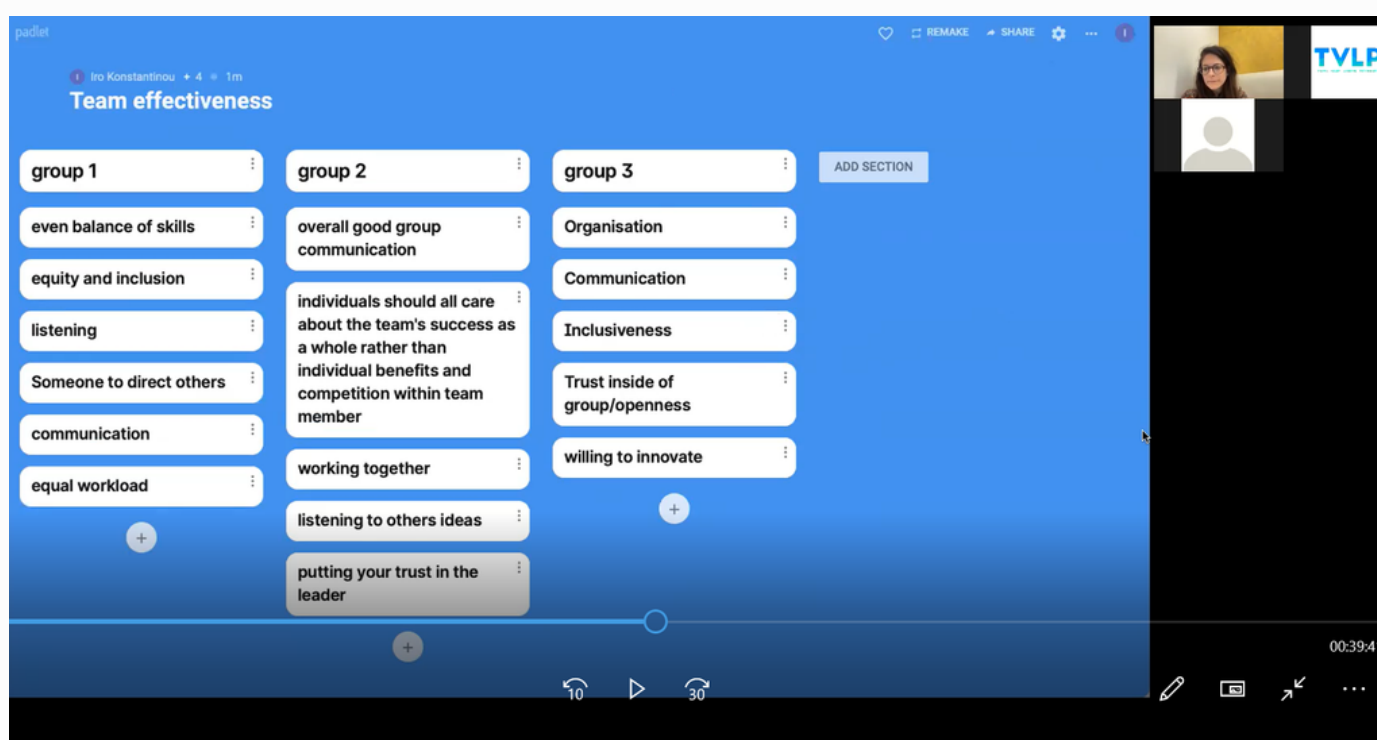

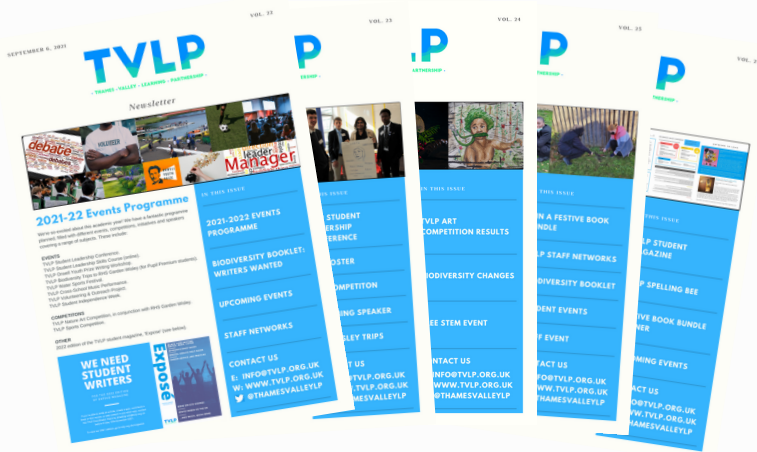

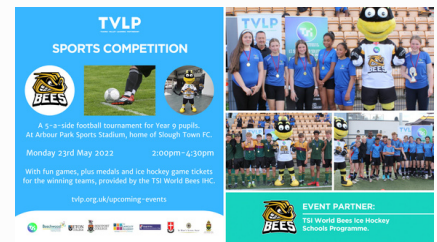

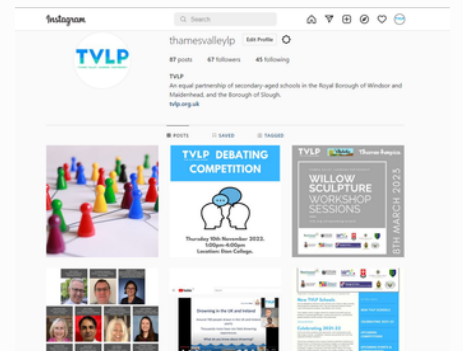
